C. The basis of real guilt is the convicting by the Holy Spirit. He reveals areas of sin to us and convicts us of them.

And a chief expression of this intrusiveness is
just the opposite : that what we have done
is not guilt-worthy so it is Satan's contention
that guilt is unreal.

D. There are three determinants of more acceptable behavior; God, others, and conscience. God determines acceptable behavior by means of the Absolute He has set forth in His Word. Others, determine behavior existentially. The Holy Spirit ministers through conscience to help define acceptable behavior.
