

4. Dr. Wynkoop speaks in terms of a relationship when defining what is moral. There are two basic assumptions in morality. First, it is relational, as opposed to mechanical. There are two main ideas concerned here. God will accommodate Himself and His provisions to each individual. [He realizes that we are not all on the same level of development due to differences in heredity, time-maturity, and environment.] Also this is a qualitative, not quantitative relationship.

The second assumption is that this is relationship of interchange, not inducements. The Holy Spirit is the one who confronts us.
